



## QUALITATIVE ANALYSIS<sup>1</sup>

As you carry out the monitoring and coding, you will doubtless come across tweets that seem useful for analysis. You will have flagged such tweets in your answers in the coding sheets. When you have accumulated all the possible items, make a selection of **three (3)** tweets that seem to be the most promising candidates for in-depth qualitative analysis.

Such tweets will help us to highlight some of the complexities and nuances that cannot be picked up through the quantitative analysis. For each of the tweets you have selected, write a short analysis in the case study template provided. Do not exceed one page of analysis.

**Important:** Please paste each tweet analysed in the space provided on the form.

Write your analysis on a separate sheet for each tweet. Try as much as possible to find:

- (i) a tweet which illustrates journalism that <u>CLEARLY CHALLENGES</u> negative stereotypes about refugees/migrants
- (ii) a tweet which illustrates journalism that <u>CLEARLY REINFORCES</u> negative stereotypes about refugees/migrants
- (iii) a tweet that illustrates a missed opportunity to create better understanding about and/or response to refugees/migrants
